LVC MOURNS THE PASSING OF PROFESSOR *EMERITA* OF ENGLISH ANNA B. DUNKLE FABER MCVAY

Anna B. Dunkle Faber McVay '48, Ph.D., of Harrisburg, a professor *emerita* of English at Lebanon Valley College, died Jan. 21 in Harrisburg Hospital. She was 94 and had been retired from the College since 1976. During nearly all of the 22 years she taught at the Valley, from 1954 to 1976, she was known as Dr. Faber because she was the wife of Capt. Elmer W. Faber '62 of the Pennsylvania State Police, whom she met and married shortly after her return to her alma mater in 1954 as a member of the English Dept. LVC TO HONOR MAJ. GEN. JESSICA L. WRIGHT AT FOUNDERS DAY—AND ALL 19,000 PA NATIONAL GUARD PERSONNEL

For the first time, Lebanon Valley College will honor a member of the military at its annual Founders Day, Tuesday, Feb. 16 at 11 a.m. in Miller Chapel. In a ceremony open to the public, the College will bestow its 31st Founders Day award on Maj. Gen. Jessica L. Wright, commander of the Pennsylvania National Guard. Based at Fort Indiantown Gap, Wright is responsible for Pennsylvania's 19,000 Air and Army National Guard personnel. LVC MATH MAJOR WINS PRIZE AT NATIONAL CONFERENCE IN SAN FRANCISCO

Curt Cenci '11 of Emmaus, a mathematical sciences major at Lebanon Valley College, won a prize in January at the Mathematical Association of America Undergraduate Poster Session in San Francisco. Cenci won one of 32 prizes awarded out of 233 entries from across the United States. His poster was titled “Quantum Information and 1-Dimensional Stabilizers in Multiparty States,” and was based on research he conducted during the summer of 2009 under the direction of LVC faculty advisors David Lyons, Ph.D., mathematical sciences, and Scott Walck, Ph.D., physics. The poster session was part of the national Joint Meetings of the Mathematical Association of America and the American Mathematical Society. THIRD ANNUAL PINK ZONE GAME

For one night, the Lebanon Valley women's basketball team will change its colors to pink, blue, and white. In its third season, the LVC women's basketball team is set to dedicate their game against Elizabethtown on Tuesday, Feb. 16 at 6 p.m. to breast cancer awareness.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL MOVES UP IN RANKINGS

The Lebanon Valley College women's basketball team moved up to #21 in the *d3hoops.com* poll this week and #20 in the WBCA/*USA Today* Coaches' Poll. LVC debuted at #23 and #24, respectively, in the polls last week. LVC is currently 19-1 overall, and sits atop the Commonwealth Conference with an 9-0 record. This season's start marks the best in the program. Previously, LVC has been ranked as high as #18 on the *d3hoops.com* top 25 poll, and the last ranking for the Dutchmen came on Jan. 5, 2003 when they were ranked 23rd.

COACH JOHN HAUS FEATURED IN *LACROSSE MAGAZINE*

Lebanon Valley College men's lacrosse coach John Haus has been featured on the web site of *Lacrosse Magazine* during the build-up to the re-launch of LVC lacrosse in March.
