The 85-voice Lebanon Valley College Concert Choir will tour central Pennsylvania this spring with a joyful program titled *Hosanna!* Praise is a theme of two of the major works on this year's program, Ralph Vaughan Williams' *Mass in G minor* and Felix Mendelssohn's motet, *Heilig* (Holy). The Concert Choir's 74th annual spring tour will take the group to host churches in Hummelstown, Kutztown, Harleysville, and Fredericksburg from Thursday, March 25 through Sunday, March 28. The Concert Choir will present the same program on campus on Sunday, April 11 at 3 p.m. in Miller Chapel. The choir is directed by Mark Mecham, D.M.A., chair of the Department of Music and the D. Clark and Edna Carmean Distinguished Professor of Music.
