DRAMATIC COMEBACK SECURES CC CROWN FOR M. TENNIS

Third-seeded Lebanon Valley staged a dramatic comeback to upset top seed Elizabethtown, 5-4, and win the Commonwealth Conference championship last Sunday. The Dutchmen (11-7) won the CC title for the sixth time overall, but this one is sweeter as it comes with the program's first-ever automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The team will find out its next step when NCAA selections are announced May 4.

W. TENNIS WINS FIRST-EVER CC TITLE

Lebanon Valley captured its first-ever Commonwealth Conference women's tennis championship last Sunday with an emphatic 5-2 win over defending champion Elizabethtown. The Dutchmen (18-3) will now make their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament, with selections announced Monday, May 4. For head coach Cliff Myers, in his 16th season, it was the first women's championship, and his day got even better when his men's team also clinched the conference title hours later.
