LVC SCIENCE SYMPOSIUM TO FEATURE CDC SCIENTIST, INTELLIGENT DESIGN, VIRUSES, BIRD FLU

*Pandemic: The Race to Understand Viruses* is the topic for the second Disappearing Boundaries Science Symposium. The two-day symposium, established to educate scientists for emerging technologies, begins today, Friday, Sept. 29 with lectures by Dr. Brian Wigdahl of the Drexel University College of Medicine; Bryan Rehm '98, a science teacher and plaintiff in the Dover Area School District Intelligent Design trial; and the keynote address by Dr. Nina Marano of the National Center for Infectious Diseases, U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. All sessions are free and open to the public. The symposium continues Saturday, Sept. 30 with three morning sessions. Numerous LVC students also will be presenting posters of their student-faculty research and floor plans for the College's new \$18+ million Neidig-Garber Science Center revitalization will be shared. In the first year of the effort, the Rowland Barnes Memorial Scholarship Fund committee raised over \$25,000 to launch the scholarship in memory of Fulton County (GA) Superior Court Judge Rowland Barnes, who was killed in his courtroom in March 2005. The ghostly image of a mother and child sinking through the ocean water on the World War I *Enlist* poster was created to persuade Americans that we should enter World War I after the Germans torpedoed and sank the Lusitania. The poster provides just one glimpse into the recent past from an engaging new exhibition at the Suzanne H. Arnold Art Gallery at Lebanon Valley College. *Designing for Victory 1914–1945: Posters from the U.S Army Heritage and Education Center*, features about 25 original posters that will be on display from Oct. 20 through Dec. 10. All Gallery events are free and open to the public, but donations are accepted.
