LAST CHANCE TO SEE WYETH EXHIBIT AT THE GALLERY

Stop in to the Suzanne H. Arnold Art Gallery before October 11 to see *N.C. Wyeth: Storyteller*. The exhibition features a small yet exquisite group of paintings by N.C. Wyeth, many of which were executed in preparation for book and magazine illustrations. A highly successful American illustrator working in the first half of the twentieth century, Wyeth is best known for his illustrations of adventure books such as *The Last of the Mohicans* and *The Deerslayer*, on display in this exhibition, as well as *Treasure Island*, *Robinson Crusoe* and others. His work appeared in

many magazines, and illustrations for the *Saturday Evening Post*, *Red Cross Magazine*, and the Hercules Powder Company are highlighted in the exhibition.
