STUDENTS AND COLLEAGUES OF DIANE M. IGLESIAS MOURN HER SUDDEN DEATH

Students at Lebanon Valley College were shocked and deeply saddened to learn of the death of their beloved Spanish professor, Diane M. Iglesias, Ph.D. She died at home in Cleona on Oct. 9 from complications of cancer. Iglesias was teaching until about a week before she died, and most people in the College community were not aware that she was ill. President Stephen C. MacDonald told a faculty meeting that Iglesias was “a rock of this College” for over 30 years, a very talented teacher, and added, with regret, that he did not have the chance to say goodbye. The Actor's Image: The Japan-Virginia Society Collection of Ukiyo-e Prints remains at the gallery until December 13. This exhibition will feature a variety of woodblock prints created in nineteenth-century Japan. Featuring Kabuki and its well-known actors, these prints offer a rich array of fascinating images that invite viewers into the lively world of Japanese art and theatre. The Ukiyo-e prints in the exhibition were created by artists of the Utagawa school and date from around 1820-1865. Many are by the renowned artist Utagawa Tokoyuni III. They were presented to the Japan-Virginia Society by the Utagawa Monjinkai, a group that supports the artists and programs of the Utagawa school. VOLLEYBALL BACK IN CC CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH AFTER 3-0 DEFEAT OF WIDENER

LVC made sure that lightning didn't strike twice for Widener this season, avenging an earlier loss to the Pride in the regular season with a 3-0 (25-12, 25-22, 25-15) sweep in a Commonwealth Conference women's volleyball semifinal match. With the win, LVC advances to the conference championship match for the third season in a row. The Dutchmen will defend the crown they won in 2008 on Nov. 7 against Elizabethtown at 6 p.m. The Blue Jays defeated Messiah, 3-0, in the other semifinal.

MEN'S SOCCER KNOCKED OUT OF CC PLAYOFFS BY #2 MESSIAH

LVC improved its effort against #2 Messiah from the first time the two squads met this season, but the result was the same. In a semifinal match of the Commonwealth Conference Championships, the Dutchmen were downed by the Falcons, 3-0.

BIG 2ND HALF LIFTS #7 LVC INTO CC TITLE GAME

Lebanon Valley scored three goals in a 3:44 span in the second half to break open a close game and beat Elizabethtown, 5-1, in a Commonwealth Conference semifinal game Wednesday. The Dutchmen (17-2) will now move on to their sixth consecutive CC Championship game, and will visit #1 Messiah, an 8-0 winner over Widener, for the sixth straight season on Saturday at a time to be announced. LVC will be making its 15th appearance overall in the conference title game.

FOOTBALL IMPROVES TO #6 IN NCAA REGIONAL RANKINGS

Lebanon Valley has moved up two spots to #6 in the second NCAA regional rankings, released Wednesday. The Dutchmen (7-1, 4-1 MAC) were #8 in last week's rankings, which marked the first appearance in program history. LVC moved up two spots after a 24-0 shutout of Widener last Saturday.
