Thirty students and four faculty/staff members are participating in the St. Bernard Parish Recovery Project in Louisiana from Sunday, January 7 to Saturday, January 13, 2007. All will assist primarily in debris-removal efforts. Volunteers traveled by plane to Camp Hope in Violet, La., and are lodged in an elementary school provided by the Project. Each day they will travel by bus to outer lying areas to aid in clean-up. PA IMPRESSIONISTS CAPTURE THE DYNAMIC EFFECTS OF LIGHT

Earth, River, and Light: Masterworks of Pennsylvania Impressionism, a collection of paintings that represents the first truly national works of artistic expression in the United States, will be on display from Jan. 12 to March 4, at the Suzanne H. Arnold Art Gallery. The exhibition is open to the public at no charge. Brian Peterson, the senior curator at the James A. Michener Art Museum in Doylestown, which organized the exhibition, is the guest speaker on Friday, Feb. 2, at 7 p.m. in Zimmerman Recital Hall. The exhibition includes more than 30 works by a diverse array of artists who became known collectively as the Pennsylvania Impressionists. Their work was celebrated for its freedom from European influence and was fueled by a passion to capture on canvas the dynamic effects of light and atmosphere on the environment.
