LEBANON VALLEY PROFESSOR ELECTED A FELLOW OF THE AMERICAN PHYSICAL SOCIETY

Dr. Michael A. Day, professor of physics at Lebanon Valley College, has been elected a Fellow of the American Physical Society (APS) for his work on Cold War physicists Robert Oppenheimer, I. I. Rabi, and E. U. Condon. The prestigious Fellow award goes to only 0.5 percent of APS’s 46,000 members (about 200 members per year) and generally to faculty at large

research universities. Day was recommended by the APS Forum on the History of Physics along with three professors from Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), the University of Minnesota, and Boston University. Read the full story [here](#).
