The Suzanne H. Arnold Art Gallery at Lebanon Valley College presents *A Seat at the Table: The American Chair* in conjunction with the College's yearlong colloquium on *Food*. This engaging, decorative arts exhibition features a wide array of American chairs from the 18th through the 20th centuries. The show will be on view through Feb. 19, 2006, and is free and open to the public.

The exhibition will examine various styles of American furniture including Chippendale, Queen Anne, the revivals of the 19th century (Gothic, Renaissance, and Rococo), Arts and Crafts, and mid-century Modernism.
