ANTHONY KENNEDY SHRIVER TO JOIN ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

Anthony Kennedy Shriver (son of Sargent Robert Shriver and Eunice Kennedy, brother of Maria Shriver), will be the special guest at a celebration on Friday, Nov. 16 recognizing the 7th anniversary of Best Buddies on the LVC campus.

Shriver is the founder of Best Buddies, an international organization which pairs college students with adults with mental retardation. The anniversary celebration will also honor Senator David Brightbill for his support and commitment to the Best Buddies Mission of Friendship in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. LVC students, Buddies, as well as other members of area high schools and colleges with Best Buddies programs will be in attendance.

"CHRISTMAS AT THE VALLEY" TO RING IN THE HOLIDAY SEASON Celebrate the season by attending "Christmas at the Valley: A Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols" on Sunday, Dec. 2 at 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. in Miller Chapel. Preludes will begin a half-hour prior to each concert, with the evening performance featuring a candlelight processional. The event is free and no reservations are necessary.

Performing groups this year include the LVC Handbell Ensemble, directed by Dr. Shelly Moorman-Stahlman; several student organists; and for the first time, the LVC Percussion Ensemble, conducted by Professor Robert Nowak. Carols will be performed by the LVC College Choir, under the direction of Dr. Michael Wojdylak; and the LVC Concert Choir and Chamber Choir, conducted by Dr. Mark Mecham.

Award-winning poet Len Roberts will read from his work on Thursday, Nov. 15 at 7 p.m. in the Leedy Theater of the Mund College Center.

Roberts has published 10 books of poetry, including *The Silent Singer: New and Selected Poems* (University of Illinois, 2001); *Learning About the Heart*, winner of Silverfish Review's 1992 annual chapbook competition, and *Black Wings*, which was

selected for the 1988 National Poetry Series by Sharon Olds. His poems have also appeared in numerous anthologies and journals, including World Poetry, the American Poetry Review, the Antioch Review, the Hudson Review, and Poetry Australia.

ATHLETICS UPDATE

This past fall, athletics at the Valley reached an all-time high for some sports. Here's how our teams fared:

* Women's soccer qualified for the Commonwealth playoffs and ECAC Championships for the second time. The team upset 20th-ranked Elizabethtown in the semifinals and nearly dethroned Messiah in the championship game (0-1 loss in OT).

* Men's soccer, along with the women's field hockey and volleyball teams, also advanced to the playoffs. Volleyball went for the first time since 1993 and earned a spot in the ECAC Championships for the first time in team history.

* The men's ice hockey team was honored by the Hershey Bears with an ECAC Northeast Championship banner. The squad won the title last March.

ART HISTORIAN TO DISCUSS POP ART IN AMERICA

Dr. Cecile Whiting, professor of art history at UCLA, will discuss "Pop Outside Manhattan, Inside L.A." on Thursday, Nov. 15 at 7 p.m. in the Zimmerman Recital Hall of the Suzanne H. Arnold Gallery. The presentation, which is free, is being held in conjunction with the College's current art exhibition, "From Pop to 'Op': American Art in the 1960s."

Whiting is the author of two books, *Antifascism in American Art* (Yale, 1989) and *A Taste for Pop: Pop Art, Gender, and Consumer Culture* (Cambridge, 1997). She holds a doctorate in art history from Stanford University, and has served on the faculty at UCLA since 1988.
